What is the Purpose of Prototyping?

- To Work out the Bugs in the Implementation of a Design <u>before</u> it is Mass Produced.
- To Ensure that Different Elements of the Design fit Together in actual practice.
- To Discover Features or Difficulties that Would Prevent the Embrace of a New Design.
- To Discover Unforeseen Consequences in a New Design or New Way of Doing

Is Prototyping a Biblical Concept?

- The concepts of Modeling and Examples is emphasized through the New Testament.
- Jesus set a Pattern for His Disciples (Mark 10:42ff; John 13:15).
- Paul held out his Life as a Model (*tupos*) for others (Acts 20:31; 1 Cor. 11:1; 1 Thess. 1:6-7, et al.).
- Jesus "prototyped" Community, Outreach and Ministry with His Disciples.

Most Modern Products are Carefully Prototyped...

- Cars undergo 3-5 Years of Designing and Prototyping before they are Mass Produced.
- Electronic Components go Through Careful Product and Consumer Testing.
- Software Goes through Alpha and Beta Prototype phases before It is Released.

Prototyping is Critical When 1 or More of the Following are True...

- When Something Novel is Being Introduced (in Contrast to A Slight Modification of Something Old).
- When Different Components Must Intersect to Form an Effective Whole.
- When the Margin for Error is Small.

The Power of Prototyping



- Major Problems Only Need to Be Fixed Once!
- Both Leaders & Members Can More Easily Excel in a Proven System.
- A Growing System Multiplies Health & Not Problems.
- Less Skilled Leaders Can Be Mobilized. (This Equals More Rapid Growth.)

The model of Jesus

- Public ministry
 - Even during this period Jesus went into a house to instruct his disciples, at night or whenever it was cold or rainy.
- Ministry in private, most likely, at least in part, in domestic houses
 - In the ancient Jewish, Christian, and Hellenistic world, a private home often provided the meeting place for religious and intellectual dialogue
 - The oikos had a central economic and social significance in the ancient world
 - We can assume that the synagogues were rather house synagogues rather than pompous structures

A movement of house churches

- "On one point nearly all NT Scholars presently agree: early Christian met almost exclusively in the homes of individual members of the congregation.
- For nearly three hunded years until the Roman empire christian gathered in private houses built initially for domestic use, not in church buildings originally constructed for the sole purpose of public worship."

House churches in missional outreach


- "By their very existence, house churches were of great importance for the expansion of the early Christian movement:
 - The way of relating, brotherly love, their sense of togetherness
 - The lifestyle stimulated the interest of their fellow citizens and presumably led them to ask the members why they were the way they were
 - In comparison to those who were not open to all (e.g., the synagogue), Christian house churches had a decisive advantage.



Life cycle of a church




- Churches with ballanced age structure: people above 65 are less than 33% of church members

Simple Church

Milton Adams

House churches, specifically Simple Church, operate out of a decentralized, grassroots paradigm that is faithful to the Seventh-day Adventist mission. This paradigm intentionally recaptures the New Testament and early Adventist roots by eliminating the professional clergy/lay person distinction. This elimination, in and of itself, naturally empowers lay-people to become Adventist front-line missionaries.
