

If ask them, as we did, people will tell you that they want a friendly church, but the research shows that the definition of friendly has changed. In the past, being friendly meant being nice: saying hello, acting courteously, handing out bulletins. Today, it means offering acceptance and respect for the person. It means community in a safe and loving environment, the totality of the experience of going to church. It means that whether people go to church in a blue suit or blue jeans, whether they show up with a bottle of water or a cup of cappuccino, whether they quote Ellen G. White or Oprah, they are welcomed, respected, and valued.

I have been to a lot of churches, some of them full of warmth, love, and a spirit of acceptance; some of them harsh and full of backbiting; some of them perfectly happy with each other, with no desire to bring in any guests. But I have never heard any of them say, "We' re critical and faultfinding; we're not as loving as we should be" or "We' re friendly with each other, but we tend to alienate visitors; we're not as loving as we should be." Every church says they're a loving church. Based on these criteria, can your congregation be honestly called loving?



A loving church is . . .

- Defined by the quality of caring, not the formality of the greeting time.
- A "home" where one's fears, joys, yearnings, and aspirations can be shared without fear of condemnation and rejection.
- A supportive community for those that are struggling.
- A place for *friends* who can be trusted, depended upon, enjoyed, and who share the same goals.

- Where God's love is experienced in a concrete way through His people.
- Where imperfections are acceptable and people discover their greatest potential.
- Where people are open and honest together without the fear of being judged.
- Where distinctions of personal rights, possessions, thoughts, emotions, and actions are secondary to a commitment to each other and to the Kingdom of God.

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Where people laugh with others, not at others; cry with others, not because of others; forgive others, and are forgiven by others; love others, and are loved by others. 6. Service Evangelism"How can I help."
